Course Description

This 2-day intensive course is made up of multiple components - lecture, interactive discussion, experiential activities, panel discussion (online), and film screening. On the first day, John will share his life story, and he will present and we will discuss the wide variety of LGBTQ+ experiences. We also learn the basics of gender & sexuality, and the contemporary understandings of LGBTQ+. We will do interactive exercises together to explore issues of diversity in more depth. On the second day, we will welcome teachers, parents, and students from the San Francisco School (https://www.sfschool.org/) to discuss the current state of LGBTQ+ education. San Francisco has been the leader of the LGBTQ+ movement, and we will have a unique opportunity to learn how this innovative school engages in LGBTQ+ education and creates a welcoming environment for LGBTQ+ students and families. Finally, we will watch one episode of the British Netflix series "Heartstopper", an LGBTQ+ comingof-age romantic comedy television series. It centers on LGBTQ+ characters, and presents their contemporary experience inside and outside school. We will reflect on the episode and discuss the issues it raises.

About the Lecturers



John Lewis and Stuart Gaffney are marriage equality experts and leaders in the LGBTQ movement in the United States. They were the plaintiffs in the 2004-2008 California lawsuit against the State Government that overturned the state's ban on same-sex marriage.

John is a graduate of Northwestern University. After graduating from Stanford Law School, he became an attorney and practised law in California. Between 2008 and 2016, he was Legal and Policy Director of Marriage Equality USA.

Stuart graduated from Yale University and served as Media Director of Marriage Equality USA between 2008 and 2016. He is currently engaged in public health research at the University of California, San Francisco.
